INTRODUCTION

The Bell Fund is committed to supporting a more equitable, diverse, inclusive and accessible industry across Canada. This means supporting screen-based producers/creators who are Indigenous and/or identify as being from an Equity-seeking community such as Black, racialized, women and gender-diverse, 2SLGBTQIA+, persons with disabilities, regional and Official Language Minority Community (OLMC), and/or emerging screen-based producers/creators and teams.

To further the commitments established in the Bell Fund's guiding principles, measure progress, and align with other funders, Bell Fund is collecting information related to identity and representation from individuals associated with applications to its programs. The self-identification data collection process allows individuals to disclose their demographic information on a voluntary basis, confidentially and securely to the Bell Fund.

This questionnaire is based on the Canada Media Fund's PERSONA-ID and Shaw Rocket Fund's data collection systems.

PURPOSE

The collection and analysis of self-identification data will allow the Bell Fund to:

- Determine compliance with assessment criteria (where applicable).
- Assess whether progress is being made in achieving the goals set out in our guiding principles.
- Consider any changes that may be required to programs to meet objectives.
- Provide aggregated data to the Board and other industry stakeholders who have an interest in the Bell Fund.

PROCESS

This is a confidential online portal for applicant shareholders and key creatives (producer, writers, directors) to complete the self-identification data collection questionnaire.

Upon completion, individuals will receive a self-identification data code (SID-code) to share with applicants to the Bell Fund. The applicants do not have access to an individual's identity data.

As part of a Bell Fund application, applicants will be required to provide a self-identification data code (SID-code) for each shareholder and key creative personnel who are confirmed as part of the project. If the SID-code is not included as part of the application, the information may not be included in the processing of the application.

2. GENDER AND SEXUAL ORIENTATION

In the context of the Bell Fund, the acronym 2SLGBTQIA+ is used to refer to individuals who identify as Two-Spirit, Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Questioning, Intersex, Asexual and sexual orientations and gender identities outside the heterosexual and cisgender norms. These individuals may or may not see themselves as part of a 2SLGBTQIA+ community but often share the common experience of discrimination and exclusion by society.

5. DISABLED PERSONS OR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES
